

Where are the Cook Islands located?

The Cook Islands are in the South Pacific Ocean,north-east of New Zealand,between American Samoa and French Polynesia. There are 15 major islands spread over 2,200,000 km<sup>2</sup> (850,000 sq mi) of ocean,divided into two distinct groups: the Southern Cook Islands and the Northern Cook Islands of coral atolls.

How big are the Cook Islands?

One of the smallest nations in the world,the Cook Islands covers a total land area of 240 sq. km. The Cook Islands are a group of 15 small islands that are spread over 2 million sq. km in the South Pacific Ocean. The 15 islands are geographically divided into the Northern and Southern island groups.

What is the official name of the Cook Islands?

The islands' official name in Cook Islands Maori is Kuki 'Airani,a transliteration of the English name. The Cook Islands were first settled around AD 1000 by Polynesian people who are thought to have migrated from Tahiti,an island 1,154 kilometres (717 mi) to the northeast of the main island of Rarotonga.

How many islands are in the Cook Islands?

The Cook Islands comprise 15 islandssplit between two island groups,which have been called individual names in indigenous languages including Cook Islands Maori and Pukapukan throughout the time they have been inhabited. The first name given by Europeans was Gente Hermosa (beautiful people) by Spanish explorers to Rakahanga in 1606.

How did the Cook Islands get its name?

However,this situation had changed by the passage of the Cook Islands Act 1915,which defined the Cooks' area and included all presently included islands. The islands' official name in Cook Islands Maori is Kuki 'Airani,a transliteration of the English name.

What happened to the Cook Islands?

In 1990,the Cook Islands signed a treaty with Francewhich delimited the maritime boundary between the Cook Islands and French Polynesia. On June 13,2008,a small majority of members of the House of Ariki attempted a coup,claiming to dissolve the elected government and to take control of the country's leadership.
