

How many new battery energy storage systems will be installed in Europe?

The latest analysis by SolarPower Europe shows that 17.2 gigawatt hours (GWh) of new battery energy storage systems (BESS) will be installed in Europe in 2023, supplying 1.7 million additional European households with electricity - an increase of 94% compared to 2022.

Which countries install the most solar & storage systems in Europe?

The Top 5 markets together, Germany, Italy, UK, Austria, and Switzerland, installed 93% of new European solar & storage. Walburga Hemetsberger, CEO of SolarPower Europe said, "As the popularity of residential solar increases, more households are realising that domestic storage systems will maximize the value of their solar PV systems.

Is Europe a leader in residential energy storage?

While China and the US dominate the market, Europe leads in residential energy storage - and this is set to expand on the continent by nearly tenfold this decade. However, by 2023 Europe will give up its leadership position to the Americas, where there will be further investment in the residential segment.

Why is battery storage so important for solar power Europe?

Walburga Hemetsberger, CEO of SolarPower Europe, said, "Growing battery storage and flexibility represents a fundamental shift from our current grid-centric view of the market. It impacts not only the way we plan infrastructure and the way we operate the system, but also the markets we engage with.

What is the market outlook for battery storage in Europe?

According to the "European Market Outlook for Battery Storage 2024-2028" by SolarPower Europe, battery storage systems with a capacity of 35.8 GWh were installed in the EU at the end of 2023. In addition to photovoltaics, growth was primarily driven by home batteries.

How much energy storage will Europe have in 2022?

Many European energy-storage markets are growing strongly, with 2.8 GW (3.3 GWh) of utility-scale energy storage newly deployed in 2022, giving an estimated total of more than 9 GWh. Looking forward, the International Energy Agency (IEA) expects global installed storage capacity to expand by 56% in the next 5 years to reach over 270 GW by 2026.
