

How many seasons does Iceland have?

Iceland is reported to have four seasons, but keep in mind that these look a little different than they might in other parts of the world. If there were a month that could be associated with spring, though, April would be that month. The average temperatures finally stay above freezing while still not skyrocketing.

Is May a good month for spring in Iceland?

May is the real month of spring in Iceland. Temperatures remain over freezing and, on some good days, can climb up to 10°C (50°F). As the driest and the least windy month of the year, May brings a huge amount of relief to the locals after the long winter. Although the averages are very promising, the weather can still be unpredictable.

Although May is the driest month of the year, it's still quite cloudy. Statistically, August offers the most sunshine in the summer months. Iceland does not treat or practice residual disinfection of groundwater, so preventive management and strong water catchment protections are vital for safe water.
