Is M-Kopa a kerosene-free energy provider?

M-Kopa -- which calls itself "the world's leading pay-as-you-go energy provider to off-grid homes" -- estimates it has saved \$206-million for the 300,000 households and businesses that use its products, while giving them 34 million hours of kerosene-free lighting a month.

Where is M-Kopa based?

M-Kopa expanded from its east African base to Nigeria in 2021 and has more recently started operations in Ghana. It is testing the market in South Africa and also running pilot projects to finance electric motorbikes as part of a new e-mobility strategy.

How does M-Kopa work?

For a deposit of \$35, buyers get the system then make 365 daily payments of \$0.43 through mobile money system M-Pesa. When it is all paid off, the system belongs to the buyer outright. M-Kopa has sold about 300,000 units in Kenya, Tanzania, Uganda and Ghana. It sells 500 units a day and it aims to sell 1-million M-Kopa systems by the end of 2017.

How many people does M-Kopa employ?

It employs 650 people in the four countries and a further 1,000 field agents. This seems like a small number against the backdrop of Africa's 1.1-billion population, but M-Kopa is a great example of disruption, not in the technology space but at the business model level.

M-KOPA was founded in 2010 on the idea that combining digital micropayments with GSM connectivity could provide affordable access to life-enhancing products. Since then, we've built a financial platform that has deployed over \$1.5 billion in credit and enabled over 5 million customers across five countries - Kenya, Uganda, Nigeria, Ghana and ...

Once the SHS has been paid for it can be used as collateral for further credit sales from M-KOPA, for example water tanks, fuel-efficient cook stoves and other productive ...

M-KOPA Solar addresses this challenge. The company was founded in 2011 by former executives behind M-PESA, the world's leading mobile payment platform. It uses an innovative approach to give low-income households in East Africa access to power: it combines mobile payments with GSM sensor technology to enable households to buy a solar home ...

M-KOPA began their pilot in October 2012 with a product bundle that included a solar panel, three lamps and a kit for charging phones. Customers made an initial deposit of KES2500 (\$25 at the time), with subsequent daily instalments of KES40 (about 40 cents at the time) via MPesa.
