What happened to Real Goods Solar?

The board of Real Goods Solar fired CEO Dennis Lacey and "determined to cease all business activities, to terminate all of the company's employees, and to commence a plan of action" to file for Chapter 7 bankruptcy in Colorado, where the company was headquartered. The company's share price had been in the tank for years.

Was RG a 'con' in the solar industry?

What it doesn't talk about is how RG was a known con among other, more altruistic grass-roots companies in the solar industry. Their very existence was thought to do more harm than good to the industry.

How did Real Goods Solar start?

A decade earlier, Real Goods Solar grew organically and through acquisition and pulled in tens of millions of dollars in revenue. Four decades ago, the company helped kick off the residential solar phenomenon by supplying panels to off-grid dwellers in the remote forests of Mendocino County, California.

What happened to RGS solar?

Blessed with a pile of cash at a time when few solar installers had it, RGS went on a buying spree. It acquired regional installers including California outfits Marin Solar, Carlson Solar, Independent Energy Systems and Regrid Power, and it later absorbed New England's Alteris Renewables.

How did financial maneuvers prolong RGS Energy's life?

"Financial maneuvers helped prolong RGS Energy's life. Through 2016 and 2017, it repeatedly raised multimillion-dollar sums through common stock offerings. But by that time, the stock price had entered terminal decline.

Is there still a legacy product installed in solar PV?

There is still a legacy product installed in the solar PV and these long-lasting products do not adopt particularly well in the consumerist corporate world of the latest/greatest smart phone, computer, TV, video game etc..
