

What is the energy policy of Trinidad and Tobago?

The Government of Trinidad and Tobago is currently developing a national energy policy green paper that recognises renewable energy's (RE) combined with energy efficiency (EE) and utilisation of compressed natural gas in the transportation sector, inter-alia, as important strategies for the promotion of sustainable development of the nation.

Who regulates the energy sector in Trinidad & Tobago?

The MEEI (Ministry of Energy and Energy Industries) manages Trinidad and Tobago's oil, gas, and mineral resources. The MEEI is responsible for monitoring, controlling, and regulating the country's energy and mineral sectors. The Regulated Industries Commission also serves as a regulator for the energy sector.
